Golden Valley High School Science Department, Mr. Powers Classroom Policies, Rules, and Grading for Biology

Objective: This course will provide the student with principles in Biology focusing on the areas of life sciences, genetics, evolution, physiology, and ecology. This course is intended to prepare students for college level lab requirements and one year worth of high school science requirements.

A. Class Requirements

- 1. Each student must have the following for class:
 - a. Three-ring binder (Colored paper will be provided for dividers. If you plan to use nicer dividers you are welcome to pursue this on your own).
 - b. Paper.
 - c. Pencil or a Pen (navy blue or black). Note: I DO NOT give out writing utensils. You must secure the appropriate writing utensil BEFORE THE BELL to avoid disciplinary measures. ABSOLUTELY NO OTHER INK COLOR (BESIDES BLUE OR BLACK) IS ACCEPTED ON ASSIGNMENTS AND FOLDER WORK. CHOOSING TO USE ANOTHER COLOR WILL RESULT IN AN AUTOMATIC ZERO EVERY TIME.
- 2. Binder Requirements: **Starts-ups** and **Notes** for each chapter or unit are collected before the chapter test to represent the **Binder portion of your grade**. Inappropriate graffiti and/or pictures are not allowed on your binders.
 - a. Your binder should be ordered in the following manner to maintain your personal organization for this class: "Startups", "Class Notes", "Homework", "Tests and Quizzes". Always keep your returned work to study and ensure your grades are correct. You will have a total of four separators.
